Tree Maintenance

In recent months there were concerns voiced about trees blocking street lights and causing damage to sidewalks and potentially our irrigation system. As a board we have sought consultation from: Maple Valley Deputy Mayor, MV Parks and Rec Director, MV City Council Member, MV Maintenance Supervisor, a local Realtor, 4 tree servicing companies, the PSE Maintenance Supervisor and a professional arborist over the last few months. The overwhelming majority opinion was the developer had planted the wrong tree species and way to close to the streetlights with 3 clear concerns: poorly lit streets, damaged sidewalks will get worse w/o intervention. The arborist (and others) recommended removal of the trees and replacement with slow growing ornamental pear shaped trees that would have spring flowers and is more suited for our environment

When our landscaper was performing Fall shut down maintenance on our irrigation system we learned that at least one irrigation line was broken by tree roots impacting overall system functionality and may be the source of an **exceptionally, unusually** high summer water bill. As a result, we will have to pay to fix the damaged line. MV City folks are working with us to confirm who owns the trees, they own the sidewalks, but we should expect continued buckling of more sidewalks around the community unless we address this sooner rather than later.

The Board would like to hear your opinions about the trees to ensure we consider all sides before moving forward.

Unexpectedly on Nov 15, City of MV removed tree limbs obstructing street lights from 4/6 trees, most likely for safety reasons. We are still working to understand if the city owns those trees after all, they did it for safety reasons or something else. The board is on a meeting cadence of every 2 months on the second Wednesday at 6pm. We are planning the tree meeting for January. Please check the website for updates.

HOA Reminders

Here some fall and winter reminders and tips:

General yard maintenance –Keep your yards neat and tidy, including regular weeding, mowing and watering; especially your front yard. Lawn mowers and landscaping material should not be visible from the street unless in use. Do not store these items in front of your house as this is a violation of our bylaws. Front yards and driveways should not have toys, tools or pretty much anything visible that is not a car.

Parking – Please continue to park according to the basic rules included in our by-laws:

- Park in the direction of the flow of traffic (always on your right).
- ◆Don't block driveways or park in driveway curb cuts.
- Don't park so that your vehicle overhangs the sidewalk.
- Never park within 30' of a fire hydrant.
- *Assist the Mail Carriers by not parking in front of the mailboxes.
- ◆Park only where a section of full height curb can accommodate your vehicle.

Traffic speed – Please make every effort to drive <u>slowly</u> through the neighborhood **(25 mph)**. Thanks for driving slowly for the kiddos.

Playground / Community Garden - Parents should be present to supervise their children at all times in the park and community garden. Damage to community property impacts us all.

Garbage/Recycle Totes – Please bring your garbage cans and totes in from the street within 24 hours of the service day. Per the CC&R's garbage cans should not be visible from the street on non-service days.

Dog clean up – Clean up all poop from your dog. We have been alerted to several problems in the park/commons area, homeowner lawns, along the grass strips between the sidewalks and the street. If you are a regular dog walker there are doggie bags for your convenience available at both ends of the park/commons area.
